Description: A table showing the schedule of opioids.

Schedule I drugs are the most tightly controlled drugs with the largest potential for abuse, and no currently approved therapeutic use; control and potential for abuse diminish through Schedule V.

Schedule I	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Heroin (research use)
Schedule II	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Codeine (when not combined)• Fentanyl -- <i>Sublimaze®</i>• Hydrocodone, alone or in combination <i>Vicodin®</i>, <i>Lortab®</i>, <i>Lortab ASA®</i>, <i>Hycomine®</i>, <i>Vicoprofen®</i>• Hydromorphone -- <i>Dilaudid®</i>• Meperidine -- <i>Demerol®</i>• Methadone• Morphine -- <i>MSContin®</i> (morphine if not combined)• Opium• Opium tincture (laudanum) for diarrhea or pain• Oxycodone -- <i>OxyContin®</i>, <i>Percocet®</i>, <i>Percodan®</i>• Oxymorphone -- <i>Nuorgan®</i>• Pantopon (injectable version of opium)
Schedule III	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Codeine (when mixed with aspirin or acetaminophen) -- <i>Tylenol #3®</i>• Buprenorphine -- <i>Buprenex®</i> (<i>not approved for use to treat opioid dependence</i>)• Buprenorphine/naloxone -- <i>Suboxone®</i>, <i>Bunavail®</i>, <i>Zubsolv®</i> and buprenorphine alone <i>Subutex®</i>• Morphine (some combination products)• Nalorphine• Paregoric (weaker tincture of opium for diarrhea)
Schedule IV	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Butorphanol -- <i>Stadol®</i> injection and nasal spray• Pentazocine -- <i>Talwin</i> injectable• Propoxyphene -- <i>Darvon®</i>, <i>Darvocet®</i>
Schedule V	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Codeine cough suppressant, mostly liquids• Hydrocodone cough suppressant, mostly liquids• Opium preparations (100 mg / 100 ml or gm) -- <i>Parepectolin</i>, <i>Kapectolin PG</i>, <i>Kaolin Pectin P.G.</i>
